

A Note From Fr. LeRoy

Over the past three years our "ACC Transition Committee" (consisting of 15 members and representatives of all four of our parishes) has met regularly to accomplish the goals as set for us by the Planning Office for the Diocese of St. Cloud. In this time our ACC Committee has accomplished many goals which include coming up with an ACC name ("Together As One") coming up with a logo, creating a single ACC bulletin, putting together a new ACC Website, bringing together our Faith Formation into a single ACC program, and finally creating an ACC Mass Schedule that should keep us situated for the next few years.

The final goal as sent to us from the Diocesan Planning Council is that each ACC combine their Parish Councils into one ACC Joint Pastoral Council. To do this we have had to draft a new ACC Joint Pastoral Council Constitution and By-laws. We are required then to send these drafts to the Planning Office and the Chancery for final approval. At present, our new Constitution and By-laws have been approved by all four of our Parish Councils of St. Peter, St. Joseph, St. Michael and St. Paul and has been sent. Now, we simply wait for their diocesan approval. What this eventually means is that within the next several months each of our four Parish Councils will disband and merge to one ACC Joint Parish Council. Doing this will enable us to work together even more closely to accomplish various programs as well as items in the future. We are now in the process of making this transition.

Since our ACC Transition Committee has completed all its mandates from the Diocese of St. Cloud, the Planning Office has asked that this committee also be dissolved to make room for our new ACC Joint Pastoral Council. Our new ACC Joint Council will now take over its duties. This said, on September 16th at our last meeting, our ACC Transition Committee has now been officially dissolved.

****One final note:** Although all 4 of our Parish Councils will be merged into one, each of the 4 Parishes of: St. Peter, St. Joseph, St. Michael and St. Paul will maintain their separate Finance Committees and Corporations. This will ensure that all their Incomes and Expenses will remain separate, so no worries about merging any finances any time soon if ever. Each parish will continue to operate fiscally on their own.

Together As One Social Justice Activities and Invitations to Service....

October is Mission Month, and Rev. Fr. Raju Pilla spoke at the liturgies at SPE and SPA last weekend, Oct. 3. Fr. Raju represents the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum, India; and will be sharing information about the mission needs of Trivandrum and asking for our support.

This weekend's column is authored by Mari Walker of St. Michael's parish. Mari is a member of the TAO Social Justice committee, a member of the Sister Parish committee for SJ and SM, and a member of the diocesan leadership committee through the Mission Office. In this column, Mari shares her understanding of "mission."

Social Justice/Mission work is not about "fixing" someone or something, to make them meet "our" standards, but rather about working alongside someone, joining them in their struggle, allowing ourselves to be a welcomed follower in their efforts. This kind of mission mindedness stands true no matter what situation or country is involved. Our personal actions may be exemplified by praying with and for individuals, giving emotional support, volunteering, donating financially, and extending a personal relationship through individual or group communication.

"Showing up", listening and being ready to engage with others is a visible example of solidarity to those in need. Mission work often displays this type of involvement, where affiliations and friendships are formed locally, nationally, and/or internationally.

"Mission", in a broader sense, is a show of support and solidarity. Perhaps it begins with curiosity and then grows into something more; a commitment to live life in an appreciation of all the blessings bestowed upon oneself and tries to give back in a service to others, to live life with a fuller view of the community lived in or of the world, a desire to get outside a normal sphere of comfort and actually experience others' struggles. Once those struggles are seen and felt, it is just one more step to be a part of the work, following and working with others to where they see a solution.

Our values are the principles and standards that guide how we live our lives and where we choose to place our energy. Spending some of our energies on mission work creates personal interactions and connections that give us opportunities to learn about and from each other in a cultural exchange that broadens our ideas and builds a global vision for peace between peoples. As part of that walking together, in addition to exchanges of prayers, gifts and cultural information and ideas, we have also engaged in exchanges of people, another's culture, life, education, business, church and more. Building relationships change the way we individually and collectively are seen and how we see others.

It is important to note that there are many underlying cultural implications for others receiving help from the United States, not all of which are positive. Mission work gives us a chance to create a different view of our world's people which can heal old stories and past experiences. It is important to form a world experience where each person has a voice in which each listens to the other.

Each of us may not have identified ourselves as a mission worker, but collectively we are a generous people sharing our time, talent, and treasure. A column later this month will provide a listing of organizations which whom our Together As One parishes have built relationships in recent years.
